



## The project YAB- Young Ambassadors against bullying and cyberbullying

Bullying and cyberbullying are risky phenomena that greatly affect the educational environment.

Young people with disabilities are more likely than their peers to experience violence, sexual abuse and bullying in schools; they also often face violence linked to their disability, as well as other, more subtle, forms of violence, such as exclusion and isolation.

The project YAB wants to provide proper, innovative and continuing support to learners with/without disabilities/special needs and to educators, in order to tackle bullying/cyberbullying issues, improve socialisation, reduce marginalisation and ease both their lives in school and their migration into adulthood.

YAB will provide support to educators and trainers in promoting equity, diversity, and inclusion in school and will promote the protagonist of young people in the development of anti-bullying campaign projects.

## PROJECT RESULTS

### *R1 - YAB Resource centre*

The interactive platform represents the main result of the project, as it will be the main tool for the training of teachers and will allow the students directly involved to work with their peers.

It will make available materials necessary for the development of the anti-bullying campaigns by students both with and without disabilities and will be the tool for the parents and community engagement on the topics of bullying and cyberbullying.

### *R2 - Collection of Anti-Bullying campaign projects*

It will consist of the collection of the projects elaborated by young ambassadors teams for the promotion of anti-bullying campaigns against students with disabilities.

It will be the result of the involvement of students in peer education activities (pilot action) and a fundamental means for promoting awareness on the topics of bullying and cyberbullying within the whole education community.
